

# What do you report, where?

## CORRUPTION

Suspected corruption **must be reported to the OPI.**



The OPI will assess the matter to determine if a potential issue of corruption is raised. If a potential issue of corruption is raised, the most likely outcome is that the matter will be referred to the ICAC for potential investigation.



### Independent Commission Against Corruption (ICAC)

The state's independent anti-corruption agency is established to identify, investigate and prevent corruption.

## MISCONDUCT

There is no mandatory requirement to report misconduct and maladministration, but there is an expectation that such conduct be reported. Misconduct and maladministration can be reported to **either the OPI or the Ombudsman.**



If the report is made to the OPI, it will be assessed to determine if the matter raises a potential issue of misconduct or maladministration. If a potential issue of misconduct or maladministration is raised, the most likely outcome is that the matter will be referred to the Ombudsman.

### Office for Public Integrity (OPI)

Receives complaints and reports about corruption, misconduct and maladministration in public administration and South Australian Police.

## MALADMINISTRATION



If the report is made to the Ombudsman, it will be assessed to determine whether an investigation will commence or an early resolution process is appropriate.

### Ombudsman SA

Takes general complaints about South Australian government agencies and councils, including matters regarding misconduct and maladministration.

**There is no wrong door - if you think something isn't right, make a report.**
